Harvest Type: Aspen Clearcut W/Reserves (19.2 AC) and Final Harvest Pine (10 Ac)

Harvest and Reserves

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.

RESERVE: red oak and marked pine

Access

Federal must be crossed to access timber sale. Logger must obtain permits/ permission from land owner/ land manager.

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Landings and Access Roads

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition before performance bond is returned.

Roads and landings must be approved by sale administrator.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage reserve trees.

Sale property boundaries painted with orange circles.

Sale cutting boundaries painted with orange or blue slashes.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Roads and skid trails must be stablized. This may involve installing water bars, strike outs, and/or mulching and seeding.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15ft of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Within the aspen block slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Within pine stand slash is to be piled at administrator approved locations. 20% of tops and limbs must be scattered throughout the permit area per Site Level Forest Management Guideline. The 20% is in addition to incidental breakage.

Regeneration Plan

Both blocks will be converted to a planted red pine stand.


