Lowland Hardwoods clearcut with reserves and Ash thin

Harvest and Reserves

Lowland Hardwoods Thin: Harvest ash, aspen and balm along with spruce and balsam 3 sticks and larger.

Ash Thin: Cut 20 foot strips, reserving 20 foot between strips

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.

Reserves: basswood, paper birch, oak, pine, elm and cedar along with spruce and balsam 2 sticks and smaller

Reserve 2-3 well formed mature ash per acre

Access

Private must be crossed to access timber sale. Logger must obtain permits/ permission from land owner/ land manager. Contact sale administrator for more information.

Landings and Access Roads

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage unmarked trees, regeneration, or reserve trees.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees.

Sale property boundaries are painted with 3 orange circles.

Sale cutting boundaries are painted with 3 orange strips.

Ash thin boundaries are painted with blue strips.

Stream center painted with 2 orange bands.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Roads and skid trails must be stabilized. This may involve installing water bars, strike outs, and/or mulching and seeding.

Restricted cutting is allowed within the RMZ. Refer to sale administrator for specific basal area or species specific requirements.

Can cross intermittent creek / drainage in 1 location. All slash must be pulled from the creek and banks rehabilitated upon sale completion.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15ft of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.


