#### Comments

Harvest Type: Lowland hardwood clearcut with reserves and tamarack final harvest

#### **Harvest and Reserves**

Lowland Hardwoods: Reserve Cedar, Elm, Oak, Pine, Ash < 8 inches, Blue marked trees and any advanced regen

Tamarack: Reserve balsam, pine, elm and 2-3 healthy mature tamarack per acre.

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Lowland Hardwoods: Harvest aspen, balm, basswood, birch, balsam, spruce and ash > 8inches

Tamarack: Harvest tamarack, spruce, aspen and balm.

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#### **Landings and Access Roads**

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Temporary water/wetland crossing needed on one or more locations. Remove crossing when harvesting activity is completed.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

#### Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage unmarked trees, regeneration, or reserve trees.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees.

Sale cutting boundaries are painted with 3 orange slashes.

Sale property boundaries are painted with 3 orange circles.

### Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15ft of all wetlands.

#### Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

#### Regeneration Plan


